SELECTIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Accident Prevention and Risk Management: Darryl Myers

As summer is almost upon us it is especially time to think about safety within our Lodges. Our economy has slowed down and gas prices have risen. Long trip vacations may just be what we can't afford, so many of us will turn to our Elks Lodges for relaxation and entertainment. We should have our Lodges in tip top shape. Take time to check floors, steps, chairs, tables, pool areas, and etc., get the idea.

You may have heard by now that the Accident Prevent Seminars have been changed to once every 2 years. Each year we were able to meet and review changes and discuss current accident trends. Now due to the cuts we will have to rely on info being passed on from Grand Insurance Office.

It is effective as of March 31, 2011; the renewal of the self-assuming Master Liability Program (which provides coverage for all Lodges and State Associations) will no longer provide secondary medical payment coverage. In the past years, this secondary coverage was used to pay deductibles or copayments not paid by other insurance (maximum \$5,000.00) and were provided on a no-fault basis. However, it is no longer feasible or beneficial to provide this first party coverage to claimants due to the existing procedural requirement related to Medicare and Medicaid. Please note this change does not affect the liability coverage of the Master Liability Policy.

Have a great Association meeting and remember the "Click-it or Ticket" program currently being enforced by law enforcement could get you that second ticket so please if you drink don't drive.

The purpose of the Auditing committee is to insure that the financial records maintained by the Secretary and Treasurer are properly reviewed, prior to the June Convention by a competent CPA, or firm engaged in that type of business, and reported to the Association meeting at that convention.

To: The TRUSTEES, OFFICERS, and MEMBERS of the VEA

The firm of Richard Jenkins, CPA, and P.C. has completed the annual review of the statement of assets, liabilities, and fund balances arising from cash transactions of the Virginia Elks Association, and the related statements of support and revenue collected and expenses paid and changes in fund balances for the year ending March 31, 2011.

This review by Richard Jenkins CPA, P.C. is based on financial records and information provided by VEA Secretary Horace Jones and VEA Treasurer Karen DeLap. Based on the information submitted, there were no material changes or modifications to the statements that does not conform to the cash basis of accounting.

The Annual Review is a review of documents submitted by and inquiries made of association personnel and is only a review and not to be considered an audit. This audit does not reflect in any manner or form an opinion of the accounting firm or this committee.

The Committee wishes to thank Horace Jones, Secretary, and Karen DeLap, Treasurer, for their promptness in submitting the records for review. Due to the change over from the previous accounting system to the Quick Books program, there has been some delay in getting all the data needed in order to complete the review in a timely basis.

The fact that the data was coming from different "spreadsheets" with different end dates brings up the issue of changing our reporting to coincide with the VEA year ended rather than the Lodge year as it is now.

The income tax returns for the year ended March 31, 2011 will be completed by July 1 and given to Horace Jones to file. These returns are not due for several months.

Re: page 5, note I, par. 4 Remains as 501 c (3) as opposed to being 501 c (8). The attached IRS letter of April 17, 2000 states that this account is considered to be 501 (c) (3). We may need to get another determination letter to our CPA.

Gratitude Grant: up to \$2,000! This Grant will be available to all Lodges that meet the GER'S per-capita goal, and is ENF'S way of saying thank you for your Lodge's generosity. This year 18 Lodges applied. Why didn't the other 13 Lodges apply? You lost \$1,000.00 that you could have given back to your community.

Impact Grants: Can be worth up to \$10,000

With the outstanding job that the District Chairmen have accomplished this year, we had 31 of 32 Lodges make GER Mike Smith's per-capita. Will the following chairmen please come forward: Steve Sabin, Southeast District; Gene McCausey, Central District; Walter Hodges, Southwest District and Gil Vale, North District?

Teri Linardich and Steve Sabin please come up front. I want to present to you the Bronze Level of "Giving Plaque" for your total Donation, to date, of over \$5,000 since becoming a member of the Elks.

And now I would like to have the Exalted Ruler from the year 2010-2011, if present, come up front; if not would the current Exalted Ruler please come forward.

Virginia Beach Lodge #2268 - 1st in State, 4th in Elkdom and 3rd in their Membership Division in Elkdom - \$79.987 per capita

Newport News Lodge #315 - 2nd in State, 11th in Elkdom - \$59.449 per capita

Suffolk Lodge #685 - 3rd in State, 52nd in Elkdom - \$24.708 per capita

The State Indoctrination Committee has added one new District Chairmen this year, Brenda Slingerland in the North District. Pat Shelor continues to serve as Chairman of the Southwest District, with Bill Vincent in the Central District and J. Steven O'Connell in the Southeast District.

The Committee is focused on having each of our Lodges place renewed emphasis on the importance of their Indoctrination Program and establish an "Indoctrination Process," designed to assist our new members in getting quickly involved at the Lodge.

The "Indoctrination Process", which begins when a Lodge receives the candidate's Application, includes an interesting and informative orientation meeting, an impressive Initiation, and prompt follow-up by the Indoctrination Committee Chairman or other Lodge Officer to make sure that the new member quickly returns to the Lodge to participate in their very first Lodge activity, project or program.

As General Chairman, I have e-mailed all Exalted Rulers and/or Secretaries asking that their Lodge commit to an Indoctrination Process. I also provided these Lodge Leaders with a copy of our Indoctrination Guidelines, a sample PowerPoint Presentation on Indoctrination, and other sample materials to help them with the planning of an interesting, informative and meaningful Indoctrination and Initiation. They were asked to share all of this information with their Indoctrination Chairman and all other Lodge Officers.

Each District Chairman has been asked to follow-up with the Lodges in their District to make sure that they received the above information and distributed it to their Officers, and to review the Guidelines and answer any questions. In addition, they have been asked to visit the Lodges in their District prior to the August District Deputy Clinic to actually observe an Indoctrination Program. The District Chairmen have also been requested to speak at the August Clinics, and all District Deputy GERS have been asked to place Indoctrination on the August Agenda.

By continuing our efforts to have the Lodges focus on the Indoctrination Process, we hope to achieve an even greater experience for our new Members, jump-start their career in Elkdom, and help make them true and faithful Elks.

A total of forty-five (45) scholarships were awarded to Virginia residents.

The **Most Valuable Student Contest**, open to all high school seniors, received 480 applications and awarded a total of forty (40) scholarships distributed as follows.

Eight (8) \$4,000, four-year Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Students Awards

Thirty-two (32) \$1,000, one-year Virginia Elks Scholarship Awards

The **Legacy Contest**, open to high school seniors whose parents and/or grandparents are active Elks, resulted in five (5) awards. Legacy awards are four-year awards with a total value of \$4,000.

Elks National Home/Protocol Report: Dr Ronald Plamondon

Protocol will be March 10-11, 2012. We will need the usual information regarding numbers, lunch, needs, etc.

There are some changes being made at the Elks Home. As you know, the Home has been subsidized in some fashion or another since its inception. The Home was never built to make money, but as a benefit to our members.

The membership was assessed to purchase the old Bedford Hotel, in 1903. It was assessed again, in 1914, to build the current Home. The operation and maintenance over the years has been provided for the most part by Grand Lodge in conjunction with subordinate lodges, then the ENF and now by membership assessment.

The first assessment in 2006 was over a million dollars which provided nicely for us. As the membership dropped, our operation and maintenance was buttressed by fundraising and an occasional draw from the Home Fund. This year our membership has dropped to \$50,000. The fundraising efforts have dropped from \$450,000 to less than \$200,000. Our electric bill has climbed to \$12,000 a month and our oil prices have tripled to \$24,000 a fill-up, which we will do 3 times a month during a harsh winter season. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to see that changes needed to be made. A consultant was brought in and confirmed some of the changes we planned to make and called for some other changes. Some of which I cannot make.

So, what are our plans? So far, between retirements and lay-offs, I have eliminated 15 positions, effective July 1st. To do that, we had to cut down on some services. Instead of cleaning rooms 7 days a week, it will be reduced to 2 days a week. We have eliminated daytime security during the week. All in all, we have shorted the staff in security, housekeeping, maintenance, and food service. We will have no pay raises for the foreseeable future, pay 10% of our insurance and pay for our meals. In short, more work and less money. The current resident's rent has increased 5%. Future residents get a 20% increase. Other expenses have gone up as well.

We're not through yet. There will be more staff to consider laying-off, and more increases in costs, since we have not addressed our Special Care as yet. That will be done next month. This will all be effective, for the most part, July 1, 2011. I thought perhaps you should hear it from the horse's mouth rather than from scuttlebutt.

This spring the camp has been very busy. Activity has centered on the kitchen of the dining hall and the two bath houses. The kitchen floor which was painted plywood was hard to clean and maintain around wet areas. The kitchen now has a new ceramic tile floor and splash base. There is new stainless steel behind all the stoves, grill, deep fryer and mixer. To add to the safety of food preparation and storage, the kitchen received a new refrigerator, deep fryer and grill. All were badly needed and will make food preparation and service better for the staff and campers alike.

The bathhouses have had old cast iron sinks since 1949 or whenever they were built. The faucets were outdated and almost impossible to get parts for. There was no vanity top for small items. At Protocol I requested each lodge that could donate \$125.00 to replace the sinks. The response was FANTASTIC. We received enough donations to do 10 sinks, and vanity tops for both bath houses. The bathhouses are now camper friendly. The Lodges have responded to the report of the condition of their respective cabins and repairs have been completed or will be by the time camp opens.

Plans are in the works to make the dining hall more handicapped accessible with the addition of toilets. This is long past due for staff and campers and can't come soon enough. More will be heard of this project in the near future. Other long range plans include a new shingle roof on the dining hall. The widening of a portion of the camp drive, building safer walk paths to the recreation field and camp fire area are just some of the improvements needed at the camp. I am pleased to report all is well as far as maintenance of the camp is concerned.
